WHITE NIGHTS

Kumo, or “cloud” in Japanese, is the new place to see and be seen in Hollywood. The bar and restaurant, owned by former talent agent Michael Ovitz, features Murano glass chandeliers and iridescent walls. WARMING HUT

The **Westin Monache Resort** is Mammoth Mountain's newest luxury accommodation. Designed by Colorado's Oz Architects (of Northstar Ski Resort's Ritz-Carlton Highlands), and located adjacent to the mountain's 15-passenger express gondola, the hotel features 230 guest rooms with gas fireplaces, fully equipped kitchens and personal ski-valet service. COTTAGE LIVING

Built 120 years ago, the Hotel del Coronado has served as the backdrop for Hollywood films, including *Some Like It Hot*, and has welcomed every president since Lyndon B. Johnson. Following a \$150 million expansion, the Del recently opened the **Beach Village**, a luxury property with 78 guest rooms and suites.
